Subj: ESTABLISHMENT OF COMPETITIVE LEVELS FOR THE BUREAU OF
MEDICINE AND SURGERY

1. Purpose. The purpose of this instruction is to define, establish, and standardize competitive level codes for civilian positions with the Bureau of Medicine and Surgery (BUMED) per references (a) and (b).

2. Scope. Definitions apply to all BUMED appropriated fund civilian positions assigned to BUMED commands, activities, and organizations. Senior Executive Service positions are not covered by this memorandum.

3. Background. Competitive levels are an integral part of the reduction-in-force (RIF) process. Competitive levels are groups of positions that are categorized by similarity of duties, responsibilities, qualifications required, and pay systems (i.e., WG and GS). Civilian employees compete for retention during a RIF within an identified competitive level. Competitive levels are established per guidelines outlined in reference (a) and consist of all positions in the competitive area that are:

a. In the same grade;

b. In the same classification series; and

c. Similar enough in duties and qualification requirements so that the incumbent of one position in the level, can perform the duties of another without loss of productivity beyond that which is normally expected in the orientation of any new, but fully qualified employee.

4. Responsibilities:

a. Deputy Chief, Total Force/Manpower (BUMED-M1) is responsible for establishing BUMED RIF specific policy guidance including competitive levels and areas.

b. The BUMED Human Resources Director is responsible for implementing, administering, and ensuring compliance with RIF policies and program requirements.

c. The Classification and Compensation Program Office of the BUMED Human Resources Office (HRO) is responsible for establishing, maintaining, and ensuring consistent application of competitive levels throughout BUMED utilizing enclosure (1).

d. BUMED HRO Specialists and Office of Civilian Human Resources (OCHR) Norfolk Classification Specialists will ensure the application of enclosure (1) and that correct competitive levels are assigned and documented on coversheets and in the Defense Civilian Personnel Data System for all current position descriptions/job descriptions and to newly classified positions. Contact will be made with subject matter experts when questions arise regarding the duties and responsibilities and similarity of a position.

e. Specialists should notify the BUMED Classification and Compensation Program Office of the need to establish new competitive levels or change existing definitions outlined in enclosure (1). Requests should be forwarded via e-mail or memo to the record format and include the justification for the addition or modification.

5. Modification of Levels. Modification of the BUMED competitive levels, enclosure (1), requires the prior approval of the BUMED Classification and Compensation Program Manager. Any approved modifications will be distributed to the BUMED HRO and OCHR Norfolk for use and application. No changes, however, may be made following the announcement of a RIF.

6. Records. Records created as a result of this instruction, regardless of media and format, shall be managed per SECNAV M-5210.1 of January 2012.

BUMED COMPETITIVE LEVEL DESCRIPTORS

Whenever competitive areas are established, competitive levels must be established and consist of positions in the competitive area that are: (1) In the same grade; (2) In the same classification series; (3) Similar enough in duties, and qualification requirements, so that the incumbent of one position in the level, upon assignment to it has the appropriate skill set, without loss of productivity beyond that normally expected in the orientation of any new, but fully qualified employee.

This appendix provides the competitive levels within Bureau of Medicine and Surgery (BUMED) and identifies the associated competitive level codes (CLC's). These CLC's are applicable to the entire BUMED, regardless of the competitive area involved, and covers all positions in the General Schedule (GS/GM) at grades 1 through 15 and Federal Wage Grade (FWS). They do not cover positions in the Senior Executive Service.

It is mandatory to establish separate CLC's: by Service (Excepted or Competitive); by appointment authority (Excepted: Schedule A or Schedule B); by pay schedule (GS or FWS); by work schedule (full time or part time); and by trainee status. All of the above can be defined by the Defense Civilian Personnel System (DCPDS) for Retention Register purposes except for Trainee status (Formal training program). A CLC has been established for this. DCPDS will read the codes and put all like positions on the same Retention Register; therefore, accuracy is important.

Only the CLC's listed below may be used. Changes, additions to, or deletions from the CLC structure will be made when necessary by the BUMED Classification Program Manager. No changes, however, will be made following the announcement of a reduction-in-force covered by these competitive levels.

BUMED's CLC's consist of four numeric characters that define the competitive levels of positions in terms of significant differences in duties (including supervisory and managerial), qualifications required, and in terms of other elements that distinguish positions that belong to the same occupational series. For quick use, match your position to the correct series, the appropriate title, the necessary skill (if any), and find the required CLC.

BASIC STRUCTURE: All codes are numerical (DO NOT USE THE LETTER O).

Four numerical digits, **0000** are used for all positions in the 0203, 0303, 0305, 0335, and 2005 at GS-04 and below that have no specialized experience requirement and are therefore only coded with the Office Automation/Typing CLC, if necessary.

There cannot be any positions coded with a CLC of **0000** in the following series: 0101, 0201, 0301, 0401, 0501, 0601, 0801, 1101, 1601, and 1701.

Four digits, **0000** are used for all other positions, unless modified as indicated below:

FIRST character/digit of the competitive level code:

S = all supervisory positions (including second and third level supervisors)

L = all GS positions titled Leader

C = Career ladder positions with a formal training plan or program such as pathways intern, recent graduates, student trainee, or upward mobility program

Since Federal Wage System (WG, WL, and WS) positions have separate pay plan designators for Supervisor and Leader, additional codes are not necessary.

SECOND character/digit will be used to identify a position requirement for office automation, stenography or nurses:

A = Office Automation/Typing

B = Stenography

C = Clinical Nurse

D = Nurse Consultant

E = Nurse Educator

F = Occupational Health Nurse

P = Nurse Practitioner

S = Nurse Specialist

THIRD AND FOURTH character/digit will be used to identify positions within a pay plan, series, and grade similar in duties, qualifications, critical elements, and working conditions so that an employee may be reassigned from one position in a competitive level to another position in the same competitive level.

00	Assigned when no supportable distinction exists between positions within the same pay plan, series, and grade. No Specialization
01-99	Assigned as appropriate and needed on the following pages in series order.
