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MISSION AND FUNCTIONS OF  
FLEET HOSPITAL OPERATIONS AND TRAINING COMMAND

1. Purpose. To publish the mission and functions of the Fleet Hospital Operations and Training Command under the mission established by OPNAVNOTE ser 09B22/9U510566 of 9 February 1989.
2. Mission. To develop and conduct functional training to support the operational mission of the Bureau of Medicine and Surgery's deployable units and perform other such functions as may be directed by higher authority.
3. Status and Command Relationships. Fleet Hospital Operations and Training Command is a shore activity in an active (fully operational) status under a commanding officer. The chain of command is as follows:

<u>Echelon</u>	<u>Command</u>
1	Chief of Naval Operations
2	Chief, Bureau of Medicine and Surgery
3	Commanding Officer, Naval Health Sciences Education and Training Command
4	Commanding Officer, Fleet Hospital Operations and Training Command

Area and Regional Coordinators: Commander in Chief, U.S. Pacific Fleet to be exercised through Commander, Naval Base, San Diego, CA.

4. Functions

- a. Ensures that a program for orientation and indoctrination of fleet hospital personnel is provided.
- b. Consolidates and coordinates teaching efforts and available resources to ensure maximum efficiency.
- c. Designs, constructs, standardizes, and evaluates curricula for fleet hospital personnel.
- d. Ensures fleet hospital participation in the Navy Integrated Training Resources Administration System (NITRAS).
- e. Develops and provides, where possible, appropriate fleet hospital training to naval personnel on an exportable basis consistent with available resources.

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f. Augments the fleet hospital assistance teams with requisite personnel for deployment as deemed appropriate by higher authority.

g. Assists the fleet hospital support office in deployment and prepositioning of the fleet hospitals.

h. Provides a platform for operational testing of various fleet hospital specific equipment and support services.

i. Operates and maintains an equal opportunity program under existing laws and regulations.

j. Operates and maintains a total quality leadership (TQL) executive steering committee to meet the objectives established by the Chief of Naval Operations and the Chief, BUMED.

k. Operates an active command physical fitness program to promote good health and ensure readiness of all personnel assigned.

l. Operates an active management control program to improve efficiency within the command.

m. Operates a command automatic data processing (ADP) security program preventing unauthorized use of equipment and data.

n. Provides or undertakes such other appropriate functions as may be directed by higher authority.
