

PATRICK A. CAMPBELL
COMMAND MASTER CHIEF

Master Chief Petty Officer Patrick A. Campbell, a native of Durham, North Carolina, enlisted in the Navy under the delayed entry program in December 1988. Following Recruit Training in Great Lakes, Illinois, he reported to San Diego, California for Mess Management Class "A" school.

Campbell's first assignment was USS Macdonough (DDG 39) homeported in Charleston, South Carolina, from 1989 to 1992, where he deployed in support of Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm. Campbell then reported to Naval Hospital Camp Lejeune, North Carolina as Dietary Leading Petty Officer.

Campbell's next assignment was to Naval Mobile Construction Battalion Seven, Gulfport, Mississippi, as Food Service Operations Leading Petty Officer from 1995-1999, completing deployments to Okinawa, Japan; Vieques, Puerto Rico; and Chinhae, South Korea in support of construction projects and humanitarian assistance.

Always looking for challenging positions, he reported to Naval Recruiting Station Durham as a Navy recruiter. Campbell was named Leads Recruiter of the Quarter and his unit was named Medium-Size Recruiting Station of the Year. In 2000, he reported to USS John F. Kennedy (CV 67), homeported at Naval Station Mayport, Florida, serving as Food Service Division Leading Petty Officer.

From 2004 to 2007, Campbell was assigned to Naval Air Station Jacksonville, Florida as Leading Chief Petty Officer for both Navy Gateway Inn and Suites and Bachelor Housing. In 2007 he reported to USS Gettysburg (CG 64) as Food Services and Supply Department Leading Chief Petty Officer.

In 2010, Campbell reported to Naval Station Guantanamo Bay, Cuba as Assistant Food Service Officer and Supply Department Leading Chief Petty Officer. During this tour, Campbell's department earned two 5-star accreditations and the Captain Edward F. Ney Memorial Award for excellence in food service.

Campbell reported to Patrol Squadron Eight (VP 8) aboard Naval Air Station Jacksonville as Command Master Chief in 2012. The command was awarded the Aviation Battle Efficiency Award (Battle "E"), Arleigh Burke Fleet Trophy, and three Retention Excellence Awards. Campbell reported to Naval Hospital Jacksonville as Command Master Chief in July 2015.

Command Master Chief Campbell is a graduate of the U.S. Navy Senior Enlisted Academy (Class 168, Purple) and the Command Master Chief/Chief of the Boat Course (Class 107) in Newport, Rhode Island.

Personal awards include the Meritorious Service Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (four awards), Navy and Marine Corps Achievement (seven awards), as well as various unit and campaign awards.
