Ospedale Di San Paolo, Via Terracina. Hospital's Department of Voluntary Interruption of Pregnancy telephone number, 081-254-8211. You need to call first to arrange an appointment. Present at 0800 on 2nd floor (II Piano) Reparto di Interruzione Volontario Di Gravidanza department.

Directions #1: Get off the Tang at the Agnano exit. At the next light you will see the San Germano Hotel on the right. Turn left and go down the hill and make the first right. Turn left, on via Terracina, keep on that road and you will see signs for Ospedale San Paolo. You can either park in the parking lot on the left or you can pay to park in car park inside the Flegrea park.
#2: Get off the Tang at the Agnano exit and go past the road you would turn on to go to the exchange. Go past the first stop light, the San Germano Hotel will be on your left. The next stop you will see the road veer to the right to AFSouth. Take a left, the first road is a one way. Go to the first light and make a left. Another road will come up and make a right. Keep going straight and you will see signs for the hospital.

Visits: The doctor will do an ultrasound then he will send you to get an EKG and lab work. He will schedule you a date for the procedure and anesthesia consult. For your appointment with the anesthesiologist bring someone along who speaks Italian. You should indicate whether you want general anesthesia or local anesthesia.

Pre-procedure: On the day of the procedure you will initially check-in at the doctor's office with a photo identification card and then complete the registration paperwork in the ER. You will be taken to a multi-patient room and placed in a gown. If he decides to insert a pill to dilate you, it will take an hour or so and you cannot move from the bed, even to go to the bathroom. If you need to go just ring the nurse and she will bring you a bedpan. When they are ready for you they will have you walk to the OR. They will have you lie on the table, insert an IV, give you medication to put you to sleep and then perform the procedure. You will wake up in the recovery room and will be discharged from there. First visit plan on at least an hour. You should indicate whether you want general anesthesia or local anesthesia.

After procedure: If you experience pain you may be given an injection similar to Motrin. If you are Rh- you will receive an injection immediately after the procedure. **Discharge:** Usually around 1400. Someone will have to drive you home. You should begin taking the methergine to help stop the bleeding and motrin for cramping immediately after procedure. You should take the doxycycline (antibiotic) at the next scheduled time and continue for the next three days. **At Home:** You should eat light to prevent nausea and rest. It is recommended you have someone stay overnight with you. Refer to Discharge Instructions.

Things to Bring: ID Card (no money), nightgown, slippers, robe, toilet paper, sanitary pad, pain medicine (motrin, Tylenol). If you get nauseated after the procedures some crackers may help.

Plan on two to three visits: Doctor's interview and lab test, anesthesia visit and surgery.

Patient will need to go to the pharmacy to pick up the following medications: Motrin, Doxycycline, Methergine.
