

Captain Greg T. Stehman, SC, USN

Captain Greg Stehman is currently serving as the Executive Officer, Navy Expeditionary Medical Support Command, Williamsburg, VA.

Captain Stehman enlisted in the Navy in 1987 as a Radioman and completed 'A' and 'C' schools in San Diego. During his tour in San Diego, he was selected to the Broadened Opportunity for Officer Selection and Training (BOOST) program. Upon graduation, he attended Texas Tech University under the NROTC Program where he graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science and received his commission in 1993. He attended Navy Supply Corps School in Athens, GA and then reported to Naval Air Reserve Santa Clara, Moffett Field, CA, where he served as the Bachelor Quarters Officer from 1995-1997. During his next tour, he served as the Material Control Officer for Helicopter Mine Countermeasures Squadron FIFTEEN (HM-15) where he deployed onboard the USS INCHON to assist with the Kosovo relief efforts from 1997-1999. After this tour, Captain Stehman separated from the naval service and entered the private sector as a Purchasing Manager for Applied Materials in Austin, TX but remained affiliated with the Naval Reserves.

Shortly after September 11, 2001, Captain Stehman was recalled back to active duty and reported to COMUSNAVCENT located in Bahrain as the N4 Watch Officer as part of the Logistics Readiness Cell from 2002-2003. During this time, he applied to the Full-Time Support (FTS) Program. Upon acceptance, he reported to Naval Mobile Construction Battalion SEVENTY-FOUR (NMCB-74) in Gulfport, MS where he deployed to Fallujah, Iraq and Okinawa, Japan from 2003-2005. During this tour, he earned the Seabee Combat Warfare Device. Following this tour, he attended the Naval War College in Newport, RI from 2005-2006 where he received a Masters of Arts in Strategic Studies. From 2006-2010, he served as the Site Director for Fleet Industrial & Supply Centers (FISC) Jacksonville, Detachment Fort Worth, at Naval Air Station Joint Reserve Base, Fort Worth, Texas. During this tour, he earned his Naval Aviation Supply Officer warfare pin. In August 2010, Captain Stehman reported to Region Mid-Atlantic Reserve Component Command (RCC MA) as the Director of Logistics & Facilities where he was responsible for the logistics and facilities for 31 Naval Operational Support Centers (NOSCs) in the region. In addition, he served as the Supply Community N4 for approximately 250 Full-Time Support/Selected Reservists in the region. In August 2013, he reported as the Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff – Logistics where he was responsible for the plans & policies for logistics for 55,000 personnel in the Naval Reserves. In addition, he served as the Supply Corps Community Manager/Mobilization Officer for the Selected Reserve Community.

In July 2015, he reported to his current position as the Executive Officer of Navy Expeditionary Medical Support Command.

His awards include the Meritorious Service Medal (4 awards), Navy Commendation Medal, Navy Achievement Medal, GWOT Expeditionary Medal, GWOT Service Medal, and Humanitarian Service Medal. He is married to the former Lori Robinson and has two children, Reagan and Addie.
