

**HMCN(FMF) EMMANUEL E. EVANGELISTA, U.S. NAVY
INTERIM COMMAND MASTER CHIEF, NAVAL HEALTH CLINIC HAWAII**



HMCN(FMF) Emmanuel Evangelista was born in Manila, Philippines. He joined the Navy on 21 July 1986 and attended Recruit Training at RTC Great Lakes, Illinois. Upon graduation, he began training at Hospital Corpsman Basic "A" School, Naval School of Health Science, Great Lakes Illinois.

Master Chief Evangelista reported to his first duty assignment January 1987 to Naval Hospital San Diego, CA where he served as General Duty Corpsman until December 1988. He then attended Field Medical Service School at Camp Pendleton, CA and reported to First Marine Division, Camp Pendleton, CA February 1989. He was assigned to 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines where he served as Senior Line Company Corpsman. In August 1990, he deployed to Saudi Arabia with 7th Marines Expeditionary Brigade in support of Operation Desert Shield. In May 1991, reported to Naval Hospital Okinawa, Japan followed by a tour with 3d Force Service Support Group and 3d Marine Division Okinawa, Japan where he was selected and initiated to the rank of Chief Petty Officer and served as the Leading Chief Petty Officer for G-1 Navy Personnel Office.

In December 2000, Master Chief Evangelista reported to Naval Ambulatory Care Center, Port Hueneme, CA and served as the Senior Enlisted Leader for Branch Medical Clinic, Point Mugu. He was augmented to First Marine Division, Camp Pendleton, CA and deployed as the Battalion Leading Chief Petty Officer of 1st Battalion, 4th Marines to Iraq in support of Operation Enduring and Iraqi Freedom. Prior to his departure at Naval Ambulatory Care Center, Port Hueneme, he was selected to the rank of Senior Chief Petty Officer.

He reported to 1st Medical Battalion, 1st Force Service Support Group on board Camp Pendleton in October 2004, for duty as Senior Enlisted Leader for Charlie Surgical Company. In August 2006 he deployed to Anbar Province, Iraq as the Navy Senior Enlisted Leader for Combat Logistic Regiment 15.

In October 2007, he reported to Naval School of Health Sciences, San Diego, CA and served as Senior Enlisted Leader for Advanced Radiology and Cardiovascular Technician School. It was there where he was selected to the rank of Master Chief Petty Officer. He then assumed the responsibility of Command Master Chief.

In October 2010, he reported to Naval Health Clinic Hawaii as Senior Enlisted Leader for both the Directorate of Administration and Directorate of Public Health. As of 29 March 2011, Master Chief Evangelista is currently assigned as the interim Command Master Chief for Naval Health Clinic Hawaii.

Master Chief Evangelista holds a Bachelor Degree in Health Care Administration and Masters Degree in Public Health from Touro University International. He earned the Fleet Marine Force Device and his personal awards include the Navy Marine Corps Commendation Medal (5 awards), Navy Marine Corps Achievement Medal (6 awards), Combat Action, Good Conduct Medal (six awards), National Defense Medal (2 awards),

Armed Forces Expeditionary Service, Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, and the Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal and various unit awards.
