CAPTAIN KIMBERLY D. DAVIS
Medical Corps, U.S. Navy
Executive Officer, Naval Health Clinic Hawaii

Captain Davis grew up in a family of Navy physicians. She graduated Magna Cum Laude from the University of Texas at Austin and received her United States Navy commission in June 1992. Captain Davis graduated from the Uniformed University of the Health Sciences Medical School in 1996 and completed a Transitional Year Internship at National Naval Medical Center Bethesda. After serving as a General Medical Officer at Naval Air Station Joint Reserve Base Fort Worth, she continued training at Naval Medical Center San Diego's Ophthalmology Residency Program. Following graduation, Captain Davis was assigned as Navy Staff Ophthalmologist and Department Head at Naval Hospital Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico and Naval Hospital Pensacola, Fla. She was then competitively selected for full-out-service fellowship training in the medical and surgical management of glaucoma at UCLA's prestigious Jules Stein Eye Institute, becoming one of two glaucoma subspecialists in Navy Medicine.



Shortly after reporting to Naval Medical Center San Diego, Captain Davis volunteered to lead the USNS Mercy Humanitarian Ophthalmology team during Pacific Partnership 2008. During this Southeast SE Asia mission, Captain Davis mentored international surgeons and residents, providing sight-restoring surgery in five countries. An established leader in Navy Graduate Medical Education, she served three years as NMCSO Transitional Year Program Director for 75 interns. As Navy Medical Corps Intern Specialty Leader from 2010 to 2013, her responsibilities included mentorship and liaison between 33 military training programs, 897 residents, and military medical leadership. Captain Davis reported as Director Public Health Services Naval Medical Center Portsmouth in August 2012. Four months later, Captain Davis was selected Director of Surgical Services with oversight of a \$56 million budget and 1,100 personnel in 13 diverse departments including the Navy's most productive Labor Deck and Operating Rooms.

Captain Davis assumed her present position as Executive Officer, Naval Health Clinic Hawaii in May 2015.

In addition to being a board certified ophthalmologist, Captain Davis is a Fellow of the American Academy of Ophthalmology, American College of Surgeons, and American Glaucoma Society. She is an active reviewer for the American Journal of Ophthalmology. In 2010, Captain Davis was peer-selected to serve on the Women in Ophthalmology Board of Directors. She received recognition as the 2014 Military Health System Navy Junior Female Physician Leader of the Year. Captain Davis is a Fellow of American College of Healthcare Executives and was recently named the Brenau University 2014 Outstanding Graduate Student in Healthcare Management. Captain Davis' personal decorations include the Meritorious Service Medal (2 awards), Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (four awards), Overseas Service Medal, Sea Service Medal, and Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal. She holds the designation of Surface Warfare Medical Department Officer and additional qualification designators for Commander, Amphibious Task Force Surgeon and Executive Medicine.
