CAPTAIN ANDREW L. FINDLEY
Medical Corps, U.S. Navy
Commanding Officer, Naval Health Clinic Hawaii

Captain Findley was born in Mobile, Ala. He received his B.S. in Biology from Spring Hill College in Mobile in 1976. In 1981, he joined the Navy under the Health Professions Scholarship Program and attended medical school at the University of South Alabama College of Medicine, graduating with his M.D. in 1985. He completed an internship and residency in general surgery at Charity Hospital and Tulane Affiliated Hospitals in New Orleans in 1990.

Captain Findley entered active duty in 1990 as a General Surgeon at U.S. Naval Hospital Guam. From 1992-1994, he completed a fellowship in Surgical Oncology at the University of Chicago, and in 1994, reported as the Director of Surgical Oncology and Attending Surgeon at Naval Medical Center San Diego. In 1996, he received the Sturtz Teaching Award, given annually by surgery residents to recognize outstanding teaching ability. Captain Findley served as Head, Department of Surgery at Naval Hospital Pensacola from 2000-2004; Senior Medical Executive, Chief of the Medical Staff and Head, General Surgery at Naval Hospital Rota, Spain from 2004-2006; and was appointed as Navy Representative, Automated Central Tumor Registry Committee in 2005.



From August 2006 to July 2010, Captain Findley served as Medical Director and Director of Clinical Operations for TRICARE Regional Office North. From 2007 through 2009, he also served as Acting Chief Operating Officer for the North Region, responsible for providing health care for 2.9 million beneficiaries in a 23 state area. In August 2010, Captain Findley returned to Naval Medical Center San Diego as the Director for Surgical Services, expertly managing a Directorate of over 1000 personnel producing over 3.8 million relative value units (RVUs) per year. He implemented numerous new programs including a Consult and Appointment Management pilot that improved access, increased caseload and decreased backlog for surgical cases. In 2012, Captain Findley reported to Tripler Army Medical Center as Deputy Commander, responsible for 4600 personnel providing healthcare to 470,000 beneficiaries in the Pacific Region.

Captain Findley deployed to Bahrain as General Surgeon, Surgical Augmentation Team Five, in support of Operation Enduring Freedom from 2002 to 2003, and to Iraq as Head, Department of Surgery, Fleet Hospital Three in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom from 2003 to 2004 – the first expeditionary medical facility established in a combat zone.

Captain Findley assumed command of Naval Health Clinic Hawaii on 16 July 2014.

Captain Findley is board certified by the American Board of Surgery and a member of the Society of Surgical Oncology and the American College of Physician Executives. His personal awards include the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, the Navy Meritorious Service Medal (two awards) and the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (three awards).
