The Deployment Return and Reunion Program (DRRP)

It is never easy for the Marines, Sailors, or family members when a deployment occurs. By knowing what to expect, learning to recognize the warning signs, and knowing where to turn for help might make the multiple phases of deployment a little easier.

The DRRP brings together a number of deployment support services available through the Chaplains Offices, Marine Corps Community Services (MCCS), Key Volunteer Network, Naval Hospital, Navy/Marine Corps Relief, Veterans Administration, and local civilian support organizations at Camp Lejeune, New River MCAS, and Cherry Point MCAS
