Per laws in most states, regardless of disability, at the age of majority (which is 18 in most states) an individual becomes an adult. Transitioning to adulthood is complex and made more challenging when the adolescent and family do not have the information needed to navigate planning for future needs. This full day training provides information and awareness of a diverse range of pertinent issues for consideration as the child with disabilities, disabling medical conditions, and/or other special needs transitions from childhood to adulthood.
