During the PL-2 or PL-3 years senior residents will partake of an international Humanitarian Assistance rotation to include a maximum of 4 weeks in Central/South America or on a shipboard mission, depending on ship's sailing schedules.

Adult ED, Orthopedics and OB/Gyn are required of all Navy interns. Air Force interns will have an elective block in place of OB/Gyn.

Call Frequency:

Inpatient:

Interns: 3 weeks day/one week night 12 hour shifts per inpatient rotation

Applies to Ward, NICU, and NSY rotations. No nights on PICU.

Senior residents: Varies from one 24 hour call per week to two weeks days/two weeks nights per block

Outpatient:

Interns: Average 4 night shifts (12 hours)/block

Seniors: Average 4 night calls (up to 24 hours) per block

Leave Policy:

PL-1: 2 weeks

PL-2: 4 weeks

PL-3: 4 weeks
