SUBJECT: Prescribing, Dispensing, and Distribution of Plan B[®] (Levonorgestrel)

Ref: (a) U.S. Food and Drug Administration "FDA News" Regarding Plan B[®]
dated 24 August 2006

This memorandum establishes guidance on procedures for the prescribing, dispensing, and distributing of Plan B[®] (Levonorgestrel). Plan B[®] is an emergency contraceptive drug approved by the FDA for the prevention of pregnancy after a contraceptive failure or after unprotected sex.

In accordance with reference (a), Plan B[®] has been approved by the FDA as both a prescription and over-the-counter (OTC) product with specific age restrictions: individuals 17 years of age and under will require a prescription, while those 18 years of age and older can obtain the drug without a prescription from a pharmacy as an OTC drug product.

Responsibilities:

- a. Medical Treatment Facility (MTF) Commanders and Commanding Officers will ensure that each MTF pharmacy develops and implements procedures for ordering, storage, dispensing, distributing, and the accounting of Plan B[®]. Each MTF will develop a written policy and procedure governing the prescription and OTC dispensing of Plan B[®], in accordance with the guidelines contained in this policy.
- b. Every patient receiving Plan B[®] will be given a patient information handout provided by the manufacturer.
- c. Each MTF Commander and Commanding Officer will develop policies to ensure that patients are able to receive Plan B[®] when their healthcare provider or pharmacists have moral or ethical beliefs that conflict with the prescribing, dispensing or distributing of Plan B[®].

Policies and Procedures:

- a. Documentation: The responsible healthcare provider will ensure that all distributions of Plan B[®], whether by prescription or OTC, are entered into the patient's electronic medical record and the AHLTA medication profile. If AHLTA is not available, Plan B[®] distribution will be documented in the patient's paper medical record.

b. MTF Pharmacies:

- 1) MTF Pharmacies may distribute Plan B[®] as an OTC to beneficiaries 18 years of age and older.
- 2) Beneficiaries 17 years old and under will require a non-refillable prescription for each dispensation.
- 3) Males requesting Plan B[®] must present their military identification card and the identification card of the eligible female beneficiary who will consume the medication.
- 4) Procedures for the stock and replenishment of Plan B[®] will be established, coordinated, and monitored by the local MTF Pharmacy.


c. MTF Emergency Room (ER):

- 1) ER distribution of Plan B[®] must be by a licensed healthcare provider and in accordance with local MTF policy.
- 2) ER distribution must be directly to the patient taking the medication.
- 3) Local policy governing ER distribution of Plan B[®] must be consistent with local policy governing ER procedures for distributing medication after the MTF main pharmacy is closed.

Limitations:

- a. Dispensation of Plan B[®] will not exceed two packs in six months per patient.
- b. Additional dispensing of Plan B[®] to a patient in excess of two packs in six months will be by prescription. Patients will be counseled on this requirement by the person dispensing the initial pack.
