



## TRAINING COURSE FACT SHEET STI 101 FOR NON-CLINICIANS

**Objective:** Increase basic understanding about sexually transmitted infections among non-clinical public health professionals, health educators, health promoters, community leaders, clergy, parents, program volunteers and individuals.

**Course Overview:** 4-hour course. Students learn:

- Basic information about some common STIs – Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, Syphilis, Genital Herpes, Human Papillomavirus and HIV. Transmission, symptoms, incubation, treatment and prevention for non-clinicians.
- Current epidemiology of selected STIs
- STI Prevention and Control Activities in the DoN
- Effective Behavioral and Structural Interventions for STI prevention



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STI 101 Course (public domain)
