



### Wounded Warriors at NMCS D And Abroad Take Part In The USOC Paralympic Sports Camp

Naval Medical Center San Diego (NMCS D) hosted the United States Olympic Committee (USOC) Paralympic Military Sports Camp Oct. 14-17. More than 60 wounded, ill or injured service men and women, including Afghanistan and Iraq War veterans, participated in the camp utilizing the facilities at (NMCS D) and the Olympic Training Center in Chula Vista.

The military sports camp was conducted by paralympic athletes and coaches, including 2008 Paralympians Jeff Fabry (archery), Rudy Garcia-Tolson (swimming), Jarrett Perry (swimming) and Russell Wolfe (archery). Participants were introduced to archery, cycling, sitting volleyball, strength & conditioning, swimming and track & field.

During USOC Paralympic Military Sports Camps veterans are introduced to adaptive sport techniques and opportunities conducted by Paralympic athletes and coaches and participate in light competition. Camps are open to all skill levels and have specific opportunities for those individuals with an interest in participating in an upcoming Paralympic Games.
