

How To Apply

All appointments for civilian PGY-1 trainees are obtained through the National Resident Matching Program 2010. To submit an application to the Naval Medical Center San Diego (NMCS D) program, please use the Electronic Residency Application Service (ERAS) 2010 via their website.

For the 2010 match, NMCS D anticipates offering two 1-year preliminary positions. Our NRMP Hospital Code number for preliminary is 140314P0. All applicants must be graduates of medical schools accredited by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME) or by the American Osteopathic Association (AOA). Applicants are required to be a graduate from an accredited U.S. medical school and must be a U.S. citizen.

+ Application Requirements include:

1. ERAS Common Application Form and Personal Statement.
2. Medical school transcripts.
3. Medical school Dean's letter.
4. USMLE Step 1 and Step 2 transcripts.
5. A minimum of three letters of recommendation in support of the application.

+ Interviews

Interviews are by invitation only and will be scheduled on Thursdays, and Fridays from December 10, 2008 to February 12, 2010.
