Rights & Responsibilities

Enrollment

Enrollment is mandatory (*per OPNAVISNT 1754.2D*) for all family members identified with medical (physical, mental, or emotion) or special educational requirements of a chronic nature (5 months or longer).

Re-enrollment

Updates are mandatory every **3 years**.

Report changes as necessary

Immediately update status as the family member's medical or educational needs change.

Privacy & Confidentiality

You will be afforded reasonable privacy in regard to the services you receive, the family member's special need(s), and/or the extent of the disability. All records are kept confidential & will not be shared without your signed consent. You have the right to be treated with respect & dignity regardless of race, culture, sex, sexual orientation, age, disability, socio-economic status, marital status, genetic disposition, and/or military status.

Individualized Support & Referral

You will be kept informed on issues that affect you & your status as participants of the EFMP program. You have the right to receive quality information, referrals, & support within the limits of services. You have the right to receive an explanation of the assistance being provided & to refuse assistance.

Reasonable Accommodations – housing

EFMP enrollees will have access to reasonable accommodations to their family housing in support of the EFM.

Reasonable Accommodations – public facilities

In accordance with PL 101-336, the American with Disabilities Act of 1990, facilities that receive government funding will provide reasonable accommodations to individuals identified with disabilities.
