Energy and Environment, Achieving LEED Silver

The replacement hospital reduces the area of exposed exterior closure, which will contribute to reduction of energy and operating costs. The facility was designed to meet the U.S. Green Building Council's Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Silver standards.

Hospital features Capabilities & Mission

FEATURES

- Single, three story building with a nearly square footprint.
- Organized with a north-south atrium space bisecting floors.
- Medical Services on first two floors, admin on third floor.
- Improved patient drop off and convenient parking access.
- Vestibules at the main entrances for protection against the elements.
- Solar shading construction provide above/between windows.

MISSION DRIVEN, FUTURE CAPABLE

- Full Diagnostic with MRI.
- Efficient patient/Staff circulation patterns.
- High traffic clinics/services near main entrance and circulation spines.
