



**CAPTAIN KATHRYN S. ELLIOTT
MEDICAL CORPS, UNITED STATES NAVY
EXECUTIVE OFFICER**

Originally from San Diego, California, Captain Elliott is Board Certified in Internal Medicine and a Fellow of the American College of Physicians. Captain Elliott was accepted into the Health Professions Scholarship Program and received a commission into the Navy Medical Corps in 1991. She holds a Bachelor of Science Degree from the University of California at Los Angeles and a Master of Science Degree from the University of Wisconsin at Madison. She graduated from the Medical College of Wisconsin in 1994.

After completing her Medicine internship at the Naval Medical Center in San Diego, she completed training as a Naval Flight Surgeon in April 1996.

From April 1996 until August 1998 she served as Flight Surgeon for Carrier Air Wing 11, completing a Western Pacific deployment aboard the USS KITTY HAWK. As one of the first carrier-based female flight surgeons, she participated in the gender integration of both the USS KITTY HAWK and the USS CARL VINSON. Upon completion of her assignment, she returned to complete her Internal Medicine residency in 2000 at the Naval Medical Center in San Diego.

Hospital assignments include tours at Naval Hospitals Yokosuka and Bremerton where she held various administrative positions, and Naval Hospital Naples where she served as the Chairman of the Executive Committee of the Medical Staff from January 2009 until May 2010.

CAPT Elliott reported as the Officer-in-Charge of Fleet Surgical Team THREE in August 2010 where she completed a highly successful 2011 Western Pacific deployment as the Commander Amphibious Task Force Surgeon for the BOXER Amphibious Ready Group. In October 2012 CAPT Elliott transferred to the Naval Hospital Camp Pendleton where she served both as the Director, Healthcare Business and as a practicing internist.

CAPT Elliott reported to the USNS COMFORT (T-AH 20) as the Executive Officer in June 2016.

She is authorized to wear the Naval Flight Surgeon and Surface Warfare Medical Officer devices. Her personal awards include the Meritorious Service Medal (two Gold Stars), Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (one Gold Star) and Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medals (one Gold Star).
