Senior Chief Hospital Corpsman Derrick Shaun Johnson hails from Queens, New York, and enlisted in the U.S. Navy in November 2008. Following completion of basic training, he reported to Naval Medical Training Center in Great Lakes, IL, for Hospital Corpsman “A” School, followed by Dental Technician “C” School. In 2013, he graduated from Preventive Medicine “C” School at Fort Sam Houston, Texas.

Senior Chief Johnson earned an Associate of Applied Technology from Central Texas College, a Bachelor of Science in Nutrition from Purdue University Global, and Lean Six Sigma Master Black Belt from the

Management and Strategy Institute. He is also a graduate of the Senior Enlisted Academy (Class 286) Orange Group. He is designated as a Master Training Specialist and is qualified as a specialist in Fleet Marine Force, Surface, Aviation, and Information warfare.

His assignments include Naval Medical Center Bethesda, Maryland, where he deployed to Kandahar, Afghanistan, as an individual augmentee with the Army; the USS Essex (LHD 2), where he deployed with the 15th Marine Expeditionary Unit; Naval Hospital Sigonella, Italy; and 7th Marine Regiment, where he deployed with 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines, in support of the Marine Air-Ground Task Force in Central Command.

Senior Chief Johnson is currently stationed at Recruit Training Command, Great Lakes. During this tour, he has served as a Recruit Division Commander (RDC), Recruit Aptitude and Motivation Program Leading Chief Petty Officer (LCPO), and Future Sailor Preparatory Course Fitness LCPO.

He has been married to his wife, Ana, for 11 years, and they have two children, Annamarie and Angelo. His personal decorations include the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (two awards), Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (three awards), Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal, and the RDC Distinguished Leadership Award for outstanding instructional and leadership performance.
