HEALTH SERVICES COLLEGIATE PROGRAM (HSCP) REQUIREMENTS & BENEFITS:

- Minimum 3.25 GPA; letters of recommendation; personal statement; 12-month commitment to Navy approved 4th year externship location.
- Pay grade of E-6 (equal to ~\$50k); full medical and dental coverage; life insurance; thrift savings plan (similar to 401k); 30 days of vacation; relevant military experience.

DIRECT ACCESSION (DA) REQUIREMENTS:

- Fully licensed and practicing audiologist; competitive application process.

TRAINING POST SELECTION:

- Officer Development School (Newport, RI) - Five weeks of the fundamentals of being a Naval Officer
- Division Officer Leadership Course (Bethesda, MD) - One week of junior officer leadership course

WHO WE ARE:

- We are **clinical doctors of hearing and balance** (Au.D.) specializing in the assessment and sustainment of both the auditory and vestibular systems relating to protection and performance.
- Currently, there are **29 audiologists** serving within the continental US (CONUS) and overseas (OCONUS).

WHAT WE DO:

- We support and **ENABLE OPERATIONAL READINESS** and Force Health Protection through hearing conservation program management, education, monitoring, protection, and performance-based solutions to prevent the most common injury in the military, noise-induced hearing damage.
- We serve as **RESEARCH CHAMPIONS** to conduct or consult on medical and auditory performance projects affecting the Navy and Marine Corps.
- We serve as **HUMAN PERFORMANCE SPECIALISTS** that contribute to education, selection, acquisition, and transition of cost-effective hearing protection and communication system solutions focused on maintaining or enhancing performance in extreme environments.
- We serve as **EDUCATORS AND MENTORS** to safety, occupational health, and military leadership on matters relating to the hearing conservation program, human performance, research, and acquisition.
- We serve as **LEADERS OF NAVY MEDICINE**. We manage both clinical and operationally-focused teams, chair Department of Defense working groups, and hold command /staff level positions at several commands.
