



**MARSHALL M. HOFFMAN, MD, FACP**  
**COMMANDER, MEDICAL CORPS, US NAVY**

Commander Hoffman is a native of Sherwood, Oregon. He is a graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy and received his commission in 2006. He earned his Doctor of Medicine degree from the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences F. Edward Hébert School of Medicine in 2010. His professional training includes internal medicine internship at National Naval Medical Center in Bethesda, Maryland, and internal medicine residency at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center Bethesda.

Operationally, he deployed as the senior regional flight surgeon and medical department head with Carrier Air Wing (CVW) 5 in the Western Pacific aboard the aircraft carriers USS George Washington (CVN 73) and USS Ronald Reagan (CVN 76) in 2015 and again aboard USS Ronald Reagan in 2016.

He has served in Navy Medicine positions including flight surgeon at Branch Health Clinic Atsugi, Japan from 2012 to 2015; staff internal medicine physician and department head at U.S. Naval Hospital Yokosuka from 2019 to 2022; and research services director at U.S. Naval Medical Research Unit (NAMRU) SOUTH in Lima, Peru from 2022 to 2024.

Hoffman assumed duties as officer in charge of Navy Bloodborne Infection Management Center in Aug 2024. He oversees the administration of the HIV program for the Department of the Navy and provides support in developing policy for HIV, Hepatitis B, and Hepatitis C in support of medical readiness.

He is board-certified in Internal Medicine and is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians. He holds an academic appointment as an Assistant Professor of Medicine at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences. He is a qualified Naval Flight Surgeon, Surface Warfare Medical Department Officer, and Navy and Marine Corps Parachutist. His personal military awards include the Meritorious Service Medal, the Joint Commendation Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (two awards), and the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (three awards).
