D₁ DEFICIENCY AWARENESS When the specimens are received at CDD, but the site did not transmit the orders data to our systems. The necessary action is for the site to process the batch through MRRS and resubmit. For CHCS and MHS Genesis, the site needs to retransmit the orders. CDD will only hold the samples submitted in SST tubes for seven days. After which, the specimens will be too old from the draw date, and the members will have to be redrawn. For most members, that is quite an inconvenience.

Bremerton and Lemoore Transition From EpiLab to CDD On April 30th, 2021, Bremerton and Lemoore transitioned their testing from EpiLab to CDD. All testing and the oversee of HIV testing will be managed by NBIMC and CDD. The transition resulted in advantages to sailor's readiness, and the blood draws decreased from 2 serum tubes to one tube. MRRS updates will be faster because the data flow will have fewer steps, and it will be more accurate.
