Alternate SST Tube Alert

CDD has been informed that due to a national tube shortage; Greiner Bio-One, CDD SST supplier, will no longer be able to provide them with 7mL (16mm x 100mm) serum separator tubes. This shortage is expected to last at least through first-quarter 2022. Greiner Bio-One has offered a 5mL (13mm x 100mm) serum separator (please see picture) as a substitute. This means that you MUST completely fill the 5 ml tube to avoid rejections due to insufficient volume. CDD will start restocking Submitting Activities using the 5 ml SST late November/early December.
