

How to Effectively Plan and Conduct Communications with Stakeholders


Attend the two-day workshop to develop and refresh the skills needed to quickly and efficiently respond to public health emergencies.

- 1. Hands-on exercises on addressing difficult questions in challenging situations
- 2. Communication tools to respond to any challenging issue
- 3. Observational and self awareness skills in nonverbal communication
- 4. How to respond to negative emotions and various stakeholder agendas
- 5. How to change perceptions of risk
- 6. How to plan and conduct public meetings
- 7. How to develop risk communication strategies and plans
- 8. How to communicate with the media
