### In the News

The transition to MHS Genesis from AHLTA and CHCS sparks renewed interest and efforts in determining best practices for disease and injury surveillance required to meet DON policy and guidance and BUMED instruction expectations. NMCPHC’s [Barriers and Practical Solutions to Medical Event Reporting](#) covers many existing military focused public health reporting barriers and considerations which continue to be applicable for the development of a strong surveillance program. The barriers discussed in this version are specific to CHCS and AHLTA users; a MHS Genesis version is in the process of being created by NEPMU5.

### Reporting Tip of the Month

The ‘Data & Analysis’ module in the new version of DRSi allows you to view DRSi RME data for your assigned UICs. The ‘Export All Case Data’ option provides a data report with a streamlined set of data points for all medical events and the ‘Export Event Specific Case Data’ report provides additional information on a specific medical event, including, Laboratory Tests and Event Related Questions. Once in the report you select the desired Medical Events, time-frames and demographics of interest and click ‘Download Report’.

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
