What instruction provides the health and sanitation requirements for Child Youth Programs?

The OPNAVINST 1700-9E CH-1 provides all requirements for Child Youth Programs, including health and sanitation requirements.

• Child Youth Programs includes Youth Recreational Centers, Child Development Centers (CDC) and Child Development Homes (CDH).

What forms should I use to inspect a CDC or CDH?

The <u>Navy Marine Corps Public Health Center - Child Youth Program Facilities</u> web page lists all of the CNIC approved inspection forms. For your convenience, they are the following:

- CNICCYP 1700/28- CYP Comprehensive Health/Sanitation Checklist
- CNICCYP 1700/13- CDH Health and Sanitation Checklist
- CNICCYP 1700/08- Medical Authorization Form/Medication Administration Form
- CNICCYP 1700/21- Medical Authorization Form/Medication Dispensation Log

How often are inspections conducted?

CYP Facilities

- CDC and SAC/youth facilities preparing food are required to have monthly inspections
 - SAC/youth facilities not preparing food on-site are required to quarterly inspections
- One inspection per year must be comprehensive, including children and personnel files, utilizing the Navy CYP Comprehensive Health/Sanitation Checklist (CNICCYP 1700/28)
 - A comprehensive inspection may fulfill a monthly inspection requirement, as outlined in OPNAVINST 1700.9

CDH Facilities

- CDH facilities are required to have annual inspections utilize the Navy CDH Health/Sanitation Checklist (CNICCYP 1700/13)
 - This form is also used for the initial health and sanitation inspection

What happens if there are violations?

- Life threatening violations identified during an inspection will be remedied immediately or the CYP will be closed*
- Non-life threatening violations will be corrected within 90-days or the CYP will be closed*
 - If there are extenuating circumstances inhibiting the correction within the 90day period, a waiver request may be submitted to CNIC via the chain-ofcommand.
- * If a CYP facility is closed due to failure to correct violations, the Secretary of the Navy must notify the Committees on Armed Services for the Senate and House.
 - Included should be the violation, the cost of remediation, and a statement of why the remediation has not occurred.
- If a CDH is closed for failure to correct violations, procedures for certification revocation will be followed.
- Preventive Medicine should work closely with all CYPs to ensure sanitation deficiencies
 are corrected in a timely manner; preventive medicine may increase the frequency of
 inspections. The medical chain of command, CYP facility director, and installation
 Commanding Officer should be made aware of unsanitary conditions that pose an
 immediate health hazard to children and staff.
