From the Command Master Chief

One achievement I look forward to seeing each year is our Sailors being recognized in the field of logistics. Each and every day our Sailors are on the deckplate supporting Navy and Marine Corps forces in obtaining and maintaining equipment, consumables, and the services necessary to support the Navy Medicine mission.

It is important that we recognize these Warriors by praising their contributions through the Bureau of Medicine and Surgery (BUMED) Medical Logistics awards program. This annual award is presented to individuals who epitomized logistics professionalism and excellence. The nominees may be involved in any or all phases of Navy logistics from early lifecycle planning to in-service logistics support.

Strong candidates will need to possess and will be graded on their leadership and management abilities, technical expertise, organizational support and responsiveness, materiel and cost savings, procedural enhancements, and contributions to audit readiness efforts. The following individual awards are designed to recognize enlisted personnel in the ranks of E-6 and below:

- (1) Enlisted Supply Technician of the Year Award for achievements in support of or in an operational environment, medical activity, or specialty command.
- (2) Operational Bio-Medical Equipment Technician of the Year for achievements in an operational environment.
- (3) Shore-Based Bio-Medical Equipment Technician of the Year for achievements in an institutional environment.

Leaders, if you see fit to recognize your Sailor(s) whose contributions have significantly supported the Navy medical logistics mission, have promoted innovative ideas and concepts that resulted in substantial and quantifiable benefits to the Navy, and have enhanced the logistics profession, I highly encourage you to submit a package to BUMED-M42 with commanding officer or officer in charge endorsement.

Remember contributions must occur in the calendar year prior to when the award is to be given. For more information the BUMEDINST 5305.3B provides specific guidance.

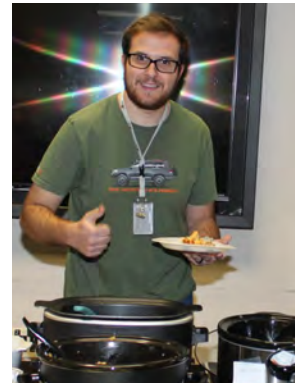
