



# United States Navy Biography

## COMMANDER OLUSEGUN A. OLABODE, MSC, USN

CDR Olusegun Olabode received his Bachelor of Science degree in Healthcare Management from Southern Illinois University in August 2005. He completed his first post-graduate degree in Healthcare Management from Marymount University in December 2006 and completed his second post-graduate degree in public health informatics from the University of Illinois at Chicago, IL, in December 2010. CDR Olabode was awarded a doctorate in Healthcare Administration from Virginia University of Lynchburg in August 2021.

In July 1998, CDR Olabode enlisted in the United States Navy under the Delayed Entry Program and attended Recruit Basic Training in September 1998. CDR Olabode completed Officer Indoctrination School in March of 2007 and reported to Naval Hospital Yokosuka, Japan, for duty as a General Healthcare Administrator. From March 2007 through April 2009, he was appointed as the Department Head for Operations Management with oversight of 42 military and civilian staff in five divisions including, Emergency Management, Post Office, Quarterdeck, Security, and Housekeeping Divisions.

From June 2009 through December 2009, he reported to Multi-National Security Transition Command (MNSTC) Baghdad, Iraq, as the Chief of Transportation in the Logistics Division of the Iraq Security Assistance Management (ISAM) Directorate. He reported to Naval Medical Center Portsmouth, VA, for duty as Division Officer, Materials Management Department in January 2010 before being selectively detailed to Naval Health Clinic Great Lakes, IL, as the Head of Materials Management Department in March 2010.

From March 2010 to April 2013, he effectively led his team through a one-of-a-kind, congressionally mandated integration of VA/DoD integration of the former North Chicago Veterans Affairs Medical Center and Naval Health Clinic Great Lakes, IL, to become the first Federal Healthcare Center (FHCC) in the nation. He was selected as the command's Junior Officer of the Year in FY 2010. He was also selected as Navy Medicine's "Junior Logistician of the Year FY 2012," by the Navy surgeon general from a pool of 53 junior medical logistics officers across Navy Medicine.

From April 2013 through June 2015, he reported to U.S. Fleet Forces Command, Norfolk, VA, as the first Fleet Medical Logistics Officer with responsibility for providing integrated logistics support and lifecycle management of Class VIIIA (medical supplies and equipment) for Navy operational units throughout the Atlantic Fleet. He concurrently served as the executive assistant to the fleet surgeon.

From July 2015 to July 2017, CDR Olabode was assigned as the Commanding Officer of 3D Medical Logistics Company, 3D Supply Battalion, Okinawa, Japan. In this capacity, he efficiently managed medical and dental capability sets valued at \$40M and proficiently led the only permanently forward deployed medical logistics company that provided responsive Class VIIIA materiel support to Marine Forces in the PACOM Area of Responsibility.

From July 2017 to May 2021, CDR Olabode was assigned to the Headquarters Marine Corps (HQMC), Installation and Logistics (I&L) Directorate, where he was solely responsible for policy formulation and management for enterprise lifecycle management of Class VIIIA to ensure optimal materiel availability and readiness in support of USMC operational forces. He was appointed by the U.S. Navy surgeon general in April 2018 to serve as Assistant Specialty Leader for the Navy Medical Logistics Community for a three-year term. He was elevated by the U.S. Navy surgeon general to serve as Specialty Leader for the Navy Medical Logistics Community in February 2021 for a three-year tenure. He was then assigned as the Officer-in-Charge of the Naval Medical Readiness Logistics Command Detachment Kaiserslautern, Germany, and concurrently as Chief of Customer Support Division at the U.S. Army Medical Materiel Command Europe (USAMMCE). He is currently the executive officer of Naval Medical Readiness Logistics Command, on Cheatham Annex, in Williamsburg, VA.

CDR Olabode is authorized to wear the Meritorious Service Medal (2), Fleet Marine Force Officer Qualification (FMFOQ) Warfare Device, Joint Services Commendation Medal, Navy Commendation Medal (4), Army Commendation Medal (2), Meritorious Unit Commendation medal, amongst many other awards.
