








Epidermis

 - Keratin cells are synthesized




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Dermis

- Supports and separates the epidermis from the cutaneous adipose tissue





 Also known as the subcutaneous layer (subQ)



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





 - Dryness



• Inspect

 Color, length, shape, configuration, cleanliness and symmetry

• Palpate

Uniformity, thickness, hardness, softness and smoothness



Special Tests

- Woods Lamp Test
- Used to identify if a lesion is caused by a fungal infection
- Lesion will fluoresce if a fungus is present





- Avoid over manipulation

 - Antibiotics

 - I&D if fluctuant
 - Antibiotics

- Signs and Symptoms
 - Starts as a small papule
 - Progresses into eroded vesicles
 - "Honey-colored crusted plaques" with erythematous base.

Cellulitis

- Signs and Symptoms
 - Large, well-defined area of erythema
 - Edema and pain
 with touch
 - The appearance and texture is that of an orange peel

- Warm soaks, bed rest, keep affected area elevated
- Antibiotics
- Refer to provider for isolation procedures

Pityriasis Rosea

- Signs and Symptoms
 - Numerous flesh-colored or mildly erythematous papules and plaques with fine scaling
 - "Herald patch" and bilateral/symmetrical lesions
 - Patient does not look ill

- Symptomatic treatment
- No medications can cure
- Expose affected areas to the sun
- Lesions sometime take as long as 8 weeks to cure
- If persistent

 varying sizes
 - Lesions erupt, weep and painful

- Antihistamines
- Wash the exposed area with soap and water
- Topical medications
- Instruct patient to avoid irritating agents

 distribution of well
 circumscribed wheals
 with red, raised
 borders
 - May be the first sign of Anaphylaxis





Herpes

- Signs and Symptoms
 - Clustered vesicles
 - Painful ulcerated lesions
 - Erythematous base
 - Develop on pharyngeal and oral mucosa
 - Rapidly ulcerate, and increase in number



- Avoid aspirin in children
- Local and/or systemic antipruritic agents for itching


