

CAPT Lacy L. Gee, Nurse Corps, U.S. Navy Executive Officer Navy Medicine Operational Training Command

Captain Gee currently serves as the Executive Officer of Navy Medicine Operational Training Command in Pensacola, Florida. She is a nurse, dually certified in Perioperative and Forensic specialties.

She began her Navy nursing career at Naval Medical Center Portsmouth (NMCP), Virginia on the inpatient Pediatrics ward and the Ambulatory Infusion Center where she served as charge nurse of both areas. While there, she deployed to Hurricane Katrina humanitarian relief onboard the USS Iwo Jima. Commander Gee's next duty



station was Naval Hospital Rota, Spain where she worked on the inpatient Multi-Service Ward and Health Promotions. She began her work as a forensic nurse at Rota and has continued her work as a sexual assault nurse examiner throughout her career. During her tour in Rota, she was accepted to the Perioperative 101 Program at Naval Hospital Jacksonville, Florida. She returned to NMCP and worked in the Main Operating Room. She deployed to Tarin Kowt, Afghanistan as part of a Role 2 Fleet Surgical Team. She served as the sole Perioperative nurse on the team, caring for over 300 complex surgical trauma patients. In her second tour in perioperative nursing, she served as the operating room's division officer at Naval Hospital Bremerton, Washington. Continuing her work in forensics, she was the training officer for the newly formed local Sexual Assault Medical Forensic Examiner (SAMFE) team and the BUMED SAMFE mobile training team. Her next hospital was Naval Hospital Twentynine Palms where she served as the Director of Surgical Services and the Senior Nurse of the Directorate. Her additional duties included Assistant SAMFE Program Manager, Interim Quality and Risk Manager, and Joint Commission Coordinator. A passionate educator, she was selected for the role of Program Director and instructor, Perioperative 101-East Coast at NMCP. She graduated 41 novice nurses with a 100% pass rate. She continues to serve as a clinical instructor for the Tri-Service SAMFE course in San Antonio. Her last assignment was at Alexander T. Augusta Military Medical Center as the Deputy Director of Clinical Support Services. She has served as the Specialty leader and Assistant Specialty leader for Perioperative Nursing and Central Sterilization Department.

Captain Gee has a Doctor of Nursing Practice-Nurse Executive from Old Dominion University and a Master of Science-Health Systems Management from Johns Hopkins University. She holds membership in the Association of Perioperative Nurses, International Association of Forensic Nurses (IAFN), and Sigma Theta Tau National Honor Society. She has served on the board of directors for IAFN, volunteering on the government affairs and foundation committees. She has authored multiple peer-reviewed journal articles and conference posters. Her personal decorations include the Joint Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (three Gold Stars), and the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal.
