

## NSOMI Welcome Aboard Package



NSOMI located at Ft Liberty, NC is the Naval Detachment within the US Army Joint Special Operations Medical Training Center (JSOMTC). Students are trained to provide life saving medical treatment to the injured as a result of combat operations.

NSOMI has 100 Navy Seats/yr in the SOCM COI, though typically we train approximately 125.

The courses at JSOMTC are considered quota Army/Navy courses, consolidated within the Special Operations Community.

U.S. Army Special Operations Command (USASOC) serves as the executive agent for USSOCOM to facilitate development, coordination, and implementation of the JSOMTC.

NSOMI Staff consists of USMC Recon HM's (LO2A), and an SWIDC (L10A). We also have an administration department with an HM1, PS1 and GScivilian. One contractor covers our communications/internet division.

## **Mission:**

**Conduct combat medical training for Special Operations Forces: Recon Corpsman, SEAL and Surface Warfare Combatant-Craft Crewman (SWCC) Medics under U.S. Special Operations Command (USSOCOM).**

## **Courses:**

- **Navy: Special Operations Combat Medic** **9 months**
  - ~8 Classes/yr 72 students per class (Navy, Army, Foreign Service)
  - ~100 Navy Seats/yr
  - ~576 students annually
- **Navy: Special Operations Independent Duty Corpsman** **4 months**
  - ~48 students annually
- **Navy/Army: Special Operations Combat Medical Skills Sustainment Course**
  - ~924 students annually **2 weeks**

**Approximately 20 International Students trained annually**

### **From I-95**

1. Take exit 46B to merge onto N Carolina 87 N toward Fayetteville 5.9 mi
2. Continue onto US-401 BUS N 0.9 mi
3. Take the N Carolina 24/N Carolina 87/Bragg Blvd exit 0.1 mi
4. Merge onto N Carolina 87 N 66 ft
5. Turn left at N Carolina 24 W/N Carolina 87 N/Bragg Blvd 9.1 mi
6. Turn left at Butner Rd 1.8 mi
7. Turn right at Reilly St 2.0 mi (2175 Reilly Rd. Stop A will be on the right)

### **From Fayetteville Regional Airport**

1. Head north on Doc Bennett Rd toward Delbert Dr 0.4 mi
2. Turn left at Airport Rd 0.5 mi
3. Take the 3rd right onto I-95 BUS N/US-301 N 1.4 mi
4. Turn left at Owen Dr 3.0 mi
5. Continue onto All American Expy 7.7 mi
6. Take the ramp onto Reilly St 3.8 mi (2175 Reilly Rd. Stop A will be on the right)

### **Basic Travel Entitlements**

Pay and Allowances for travel is based on an individual meeting specific eligibility criterion. Check with your disbursing office to determine your specific entitlements.

### **Advanced Pay and Allowance**

Advanced pay can be drawn up to 60 days prior to your move. No more than three months of advance pay can be drawn and must be approved by your Commanding Officer. The advance is normally repaid in equal installments over 12 months. In certain cases, repayment can be spread over 24 months. If an advance for rental housing is needed, an advance housing allowance may be issued by the disbursing officer. You must have already rented housing and must provide a copy of the rental agreement to document the housing costs.

### **Dislocation Allowance (DLA)**

Active Duty personnel are entitled to a Dislocation Allowance to offset some of the costs of closing one home and setting up another. These costs include rent deposits, utility hookups, etc. DLA can be drawn up to 10-days in advance.

DLA is not available to service members who:

- are without family members and are assigned to unaccompanied government quarters.
- are transferred to a new duty station or to the same geographical location.
- on separation or retirement orders.

### **Per Diem Allowance**

Refer to the Per Diem Rates chart for exact amounts.

Along with the DLA, food and lodging costs are reimbursed when making a Permanent Change of Station (PCS) move. The allowance is paid at a daily rate for you and your family members. Auto travel is at the rate of 350 miles per day (not to exceed the official authorized distance) and is used to determine how many days per diem will be paid.
