Master Chief Carroll is originally from Kemp, Texas. He graduated from Christian Life Fellowship Academy in 1993. Master Chief Carroll joined the Navy in the spring of 1993 and reported to Recruit Training Command San Diego in May 1993. In August 1993, he reported to Aircrew Survival Equipmentman (PR) "A" school in Millington, Tennessee.

After attending PR "A" school, Master Chief Carroll reported to VFA-25 "Fist of the Fleet" at NAS Lemoore, California. He was responsible for the organizational level maintenance on Aviation Life Support Systems for pilots flying the F/A-18 Hornet. He made multiple underway periods and deployments on the USS Carl Vinson "America's favorite carrier" to South West Asia in support of various campaigns. In November 1996, he was selected to assist Aircraft Intermediate Maintenance Department (AIMD) Lemoore for 5 months supporting maintenance for 13 squadrons.

In August 1997, Master Chief Carroll reported to AIMD Marine Corps Base Hawaii. He provided intermediate level maintenance support for Marine Air Logistics Squadron-24 for the Navy and Marine Corps

In May of 2000, Master Chief Carroll reported to SEAL Delivery Team ONE. As the Air Operations Division Leading Petty Officer (LPO) he managed the maintenance of over 2,400 parachute systems and ancillary equipment. During this tour, Master Chief Carroll earned the qualifications of Military Freefall Parachutist, Drop Zone Safety Officer, Static line Jumpmaster, Special Operations Parachute Rigger, NALO Aircraft Coordinator, and Federal Aviation Master Parachute Rigger.

In July of 2004, Master Chief Carroll reported to Naval Air Technical Training Center (NATTC). As the PR/AME Training Division LPO he was responsible for the direct management of PR "A" school courses, providing quality instruction and training to 980 Navy and Marine Corps students annually. During this assignment, Master Chief Carroll was designated as a Master Training Specialist and was promoted to Chief Petty Officer.

In September 2008, Master Chief Carroll reported to USS Carl Vinson CVN-70. As a new Chief, he was tapped as the Light Industrial Facility Leading Chief Petty Officer (LCPO) while the ship went through an arduous yard period. He was ultimately assigned as the Intermediate Maintenance Department 2nd Division LCPO underway. He led four Chiefs and 39 personnel in the maintenance support of eight CVW-17 Squadrons and was promoted to Senior Chief Petty Officer (SCPO).

In January 2011, Master Chief Carroll reported to Naval Special Warfare Group ONE, Logistic Support Unit as the Operations Department Senior Enlisted Advisor and Air Operations Division Officer. He led nine Chiefs and 35 personnel in the operational maintenance and support of five SEAL Teams and two forward deployed units. He led critical operational support requirements between eight command

departments facilitating 686 air, dive and engineering requests. He managed 1,531 parachute systems, a \$7 million equipage inventory, and \$230,000 OPTAR budget.

In May 2014, Master Chief Carroll reported to Fleet Readiness Center South East as the Aviation Life Support Division LCPO. He was responsible for the production efforts of 32 personnel in four work centers, only onboard for one month, and promoted to Master Chief Petty Officer (MCPO). He was reassigned as the Senior Enlisted Leader for 46 MCPOs, SCPOs, and CPOs leading 641 Sailors.

In September 2015, Master Chief Carroll transferred back to NATTC as the PR/AME Training Officer leading 43 Navy and Marine Corps instructors and training 868 students annually.

In September 2018, Master Chief Carroll reported to Center for Naval Aviation Technical Training as the N7 Training Department LCPO and Ready Relevant Learning Program Manager. He coordinated the efforts of US Fleet Forces, Naval Education Training Command, Chief Naval Air Forces, and Naval Air Warfare with NATTC Aviation Learning Sites maintaining oversight in the timely execution of over \$50 million supporting the buildup and enhancement of curriculum, equipment/trainers electronic classrooms, and manpower requirements for 74 Naval Aviation Enterprise courses.

In October 2021, Master Chief Carroll reported to his current assignment as the Naval Survival Training Institute Senior Enlisted Leader. In this role, Master Chief Carroll directs the oversight of 290 officers, enlisted, and civilian personnel at eight Aviation Survival Training Centers and headquarters element providing high-risk training to 19,000 warfighters annually.

His personal awards include one Defense Meritorious Service Medal, six Navy Commendation Medals, two Navy Achievement Medals, and multiple unit and campaign decorations.
