

As part of your officer development, you will be paired with Naval Officers in the fleet, spending part of your summer gaining on-the-job experience in various areas—including on-board a nuclear submarine, with aircraft carriers and aviation squadrons or on warships operating out at sea.

SCHOLARSHIP BENEFITS

- Up to \$200,000+ to cover the cost of a degree at a participating college or university

SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- Must be a U.S. citizen
- High school graduate
- Be between 17-23 years old by September 1 of the year starting college
- No criminal record
- Be physically/medically qualified by Navy standards
- Be admitted to an approved Navy ROTC college or university

SAT OR ACT REQUIREMENTS

- SAT: Minimum 550 Evidenced Based Reading and Writing (EBRW) and 540 Math; combined scores must total at least 1100.

OR

ACT: Minimum 22 English and 21 Math; combined scores must total at least 44.

OR

- A cumulative high school GPA of 2.75 (on a 4.0 Scale) AND a 2.0 grade (on a 4.0 Scale) in Algebra II (or equivalent course) AND a statement from their high school guidance counselor or senior JROTC instructor certifying that SAT and ACT testing was not reasonably available to the applicant.



NROTC COURSE LOAD

- Naval Science Classes
- Weekly NROTC “Labs” = Drill Instruction
- English Grammar and Composition
- One year of Calculus
- One year of Physics
- National Security Policy/American Military Affairs





DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

- No service commitment until after the first year of college
- Upon completion of degree, receive commission as an Officer in the U.S. Navy
- Active-duty service obligation upon commissioning
- High-demand degrees:
 - Engineering
 - Math
 - Science
 - Foreign Language

NROTC NURSING

- Earn up to \$200,000+ to cover the cost of a degree
- Available to students interested in pursuing a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) at a participating college or university
- Upon graduation, commission as an Officer in the U.S. Navy Nurse Corps





MINORITY SERVING INSTITUTION SCHOLARSHIP RESERVATION (MSISR)

- Earn up to \$200,000+ to cover the cost of a degree at one of the associated:
 - Historically Black Colleges & Universities (HBCUs)
 - Hispanic-Serving Institutions (HSIs)
 - Minority Serving Institutions (MSIs)
- Monthly allowance while in college
- Participate in weekly NROTC drill periods and two 4-week summer training periods
- Upon graduation, commission as an Officer in the U.S. Navy
