## Updates: Almost 54,000 DoD personnel are supporting COVID relief

- **U.S. Northern Command** is responsible for DoD's COVID-19 operations in support of FEMA, with over 7,500 people deployed, including 225 medical personnel. This includes about 170 medical providers working at three New York City-area hospitals. USNORTHCOM is returning forces to their services and home stations as state and local requirements diminish.
- Approximately 42,000 members of the **National Guard** are supporting COVID-19 response efforts at their governors' direction.
- The **U.S. Army Corps of Engineers** has 64 FEMA Mission Assignments totaling \$1.8 billion (8 open / 56 closed), with 545 deployed in support of COVID-19 response operations. USACE has assessed 1,155 sites for use as Alternate Care Facilities (ACFs) with 35 of 38 ACF construction contracts complete.
