the assault took place.

There are two types of reporting options:


Restricted

Unrestricted

It is important to understand your sexual assault reporting options. Please contact the duty victim advocate at (843)478-8615 or the **DoD Safe Helpline** to preserve your reporting options.

Regardless of how you choose to report sexual assault, you will be offered a full range of advocacy, medical and counseling services.

Remember, if you initially make a restricted report, you can change it to an unrestricted report at a later date. However, if you initially make an unrestricted report, it cannot be changed to a restricted report.



## SEXUAL ASSAULT RESOURCES
